



Carroll High School is a four-year co-educational school in the eastern residential areas of Dayton, Ohio. It is a part of the parochial system of the Archdiocese of Cincinnati and is accredited with the Department of Education, State of Ohio.
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SCHOOL ENVIRONMENT

The areas served consist primarily of professionally established and middle-income families, including Wright Patterson Air Force Base. The faculty consists of 59 members, 70% having Master degrees or higher. The enrollment for the 2015-2016 school year is 741. The class of 2016 is made up of 173 seniors. The class of 2015 earned the following distribution of test scores:

CURRICULUM/GRADING SYSTEMS

Carroll High School’s curriculum consists of approximately 160 course selections. Credit is given at the end of each semester. All Science courses are lab-oriented. All English courses include reading, writing, and speaking experiences. There are seven class periods per day, averaging 50 minutes each. Students are required to take six subjects. Twenty-three credits, including a yearly Religion program, are required for graduation. Twenty-seven honors courses are offered in English, Math, Science, Social Studies, Foreign Language, and Music. Sixteen Advanced Placement courses are offered in English Language, English Literature, Calculus, Statistics, Biology, Chemistry, Physics, Government, Macroeconomics, Psychology, US History, Spanish, Computer Science, Studio Drawing, Studio Design, and Music Theory. Carroll High School offers in-house College Credit Plus courses in AP Calculus, Honors Algebra II/Trig, Finite Math, Honors Personal Finance, English Composition, and Public Speaking.

Carroll’s grading standards are as follows:

A = 4.0 (100-93)	B = 3.0 (92-85)
C = 2.0 (84-77)	D = 1.0 (76-70)
F = 0.0 (69-0)	P = Passing

GPA is reported on a 4.0 scale. A weighted GPA is also reported for students with Honors and AP courses. This weighted GPA is calculated by adding one point for each Honors or AP course. In fairness to our competitive student body, Carroll does not rank students. Quality points represent the degree of difficulty of a course. They are indicated by the fourth digit in the course number of each subject. This number is recorded on the transcript before the course title. The higher the fourth digit, the greater the difficulty. The digits of 5 and 6 represent Honors and AP courses and have a weighted letter grade value. All subjects within the seven period day are included in grade point average.

From the class of 2015, 95% of our students enrolled in college (79% to 4 year institutions and 16 % to 2 year institutions), and 2% enlisted in Military Service.
