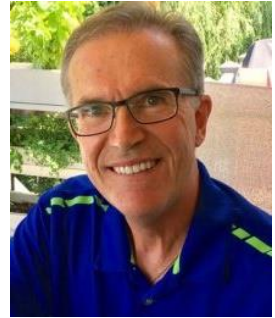

Greg Notestine, DDS Class of 1971



After completing a general practice residency at Miami Valley Hospital, Dr. Notestine opened his own general/family dentistry practice in 1978 with the help of his wife, Karen (Heider) Notestine '73. Accredited by the American Academy of Cosmetic Dentistry (AACD), Greg dedicated his professional life to helping others' smiles look and feel their best.

Dr. Notestine now limits his practice to diagnosing, treating, teaching and lecturing about tongue-tie and other oral restrictions, collectively referred to as TOTS (Tethered Oral Tissues). People travel great distances from all over the Midwest for his care and expertise hence the name of his new practice, Midwest Tongue Tie Care. He successfully treated the first of many tongue tied infants in 1984, and since then, he has continued to treat all ages of people with this congenital defect. He is a published author, lecturer, and practitioner on the importance of evaluating and treating tongue tied infants.

Greg earned a Bachelor's Degree in Biological Sciences from Wright State University and his DDS from The Ohio State University College of Dentistry. He was also inducted into Carroll High School's Distinguished Alumni Hall of Fame in 2009.

Greg consistently serves the community by volunteering at the Good Neighbor House Health Clinic and donating dental care for the working poor. He previously served at St. Vincent DePaul Dental Clinic. Through the "Give Back a Smile" Program in the AACD, Greg donates cosmetic dental work to local recovering victims of domestic violence, restoring their smiles to help give back their self-esteem. Greg has also served on numerous boards and he gives human growth and development lectures at local Catholic elementary schools and talks to Kindergarteners about Dental Health.

Greg is also a consistent contributor and volunteer at Carroll, designs and provides athletic mouth guards for Carroll athletes, and participates as a Science Fair Judge and as a motivational speaker on "Athletes as Christian Leaders" for the Carroll and Wright State Baseball teams. His two children, Luke and Bethany, also attended Carroll.

While at Carroll, Greg fondly remembers making the baseball team, acting in plays with the Drama Club and being given the chance to wrestle as a senior. He credits the dedication of Carroll's Catholic educators, who teach as a ministry, in developing in him the desire to love and care for people. Greg is truly dedicated to Carroll's alumni and students. With grace, talent and commitment, he exemplifies what it means to be a Carroll Patriot.
