Graduation requirements from the state of Ohio mandate that students need a 1.0 credit (2 classes) in Fine Art or the Performing Arts. If you would like to take four years of art, you will need to schedule carefully. Elect to take a study hall only if you must have one to ensure academic success. Take advantage of the summer and online courses offered at **Carroll.** Physical education courses are offered in the summer by most area public schools. **PE exemptions** are available for students who complete two seasons of interscholastic sports or Marching Band. Take an art class for enjoyment or for preparation for a professional career. Carroll art students are given the opportunity to enter a variety of art competitions, and have received over 560 art show placements and wins. Traditional art studio classes with state of the art technology are offered. We have two art rooms, one that features an actual studio art space and the other room which includes 22 brand new computers with the latest version of Photoshop for Digital Photography.
