Dear Students and Parents,

Even though we are just starting to get into the rhythm of summer, we want to provide you with some important information for the 2022-2023 school year.

The school year will begin on Monday, August 15, 2022. On this day, **freshmen** will have a full day starting at 8:00 a.m. **Transfer students** will attend an orientation session from 8:00 a.m. – 11:00 a.m. On Tuesday, August 16, all students will report by 8:00 a.m.

Everyone is asked to pick up class schedules on Wednesday, August 3, between 9:00 a.m. and 3:00 p.m. Schedule changes will only be made for academic reasons and must be approved by the Dean of Academics. The band and guard will be holding a Used Uniform Sale during these hours or until the merchandise is gone. The Spirit Shop will be open that day for purchase of spirit wear and the 1/4 zip uniform pullover.

Archbishop Carroll students will be required to have an ID card in their possession at all times. This card can be used as a debit card to purchase lunch, check out textbooks from the bookstore, and can be used for admittance at all home athletic events. Returning students will have their badges ready on the first day of school using pictures from last school year. However, **ALL new students must have their picture taken on August 3 during schedule pick up.** All students who drive to school will need to purchase a parking pass. Information on this process was sent to students via email earlier in the summer.

We would like to remind you that **before your student can get his/her schedule you will need to** access your Family Portal to complete the enrollment/re-enrollment process.
