Master of Ceremony Cheryl McHenry Class of 1974



In 2008, Cheryl (McHenry) Chabali was inducted into Archbishop Carroll High School's Inaugural Distinguished Alumni Hall of Fame for her outstanding career achievement. Since 1991, Cheryl has served as the News Center 7 Evening News Anchor at WHIO-TV.

After graduating from Carroll, she earned her Bachelor of Arts degree in Broadcasting from the University of Cincinnati. As a senior at UC, she was fortunate to have an internship at WKRC radio. Cheryl worked in radio news for three years, with stints at WING radio in Dayton and WCKY in Cincinnati, before landing a job as a reporter at WHIO-TV in August of 1981.

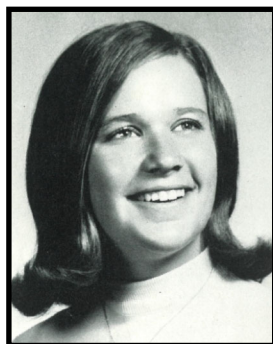
For much of the 1980's, she covered the Dayton Police/Montgomery County Courts beat, reporting on all kinds of stories from the local criminal justice system. During those years, Cheryl won four Emmy awards. Three of them were for *Spot News* (now called *Breaking News*), and one for *Investigative News* for a 3-part series on repeat drunk driving offenders (1990). Since 2013, Cheryl has added four more Emmys for four half-hour special reports. One was *Miami Valley Murder Mysteries* (2013); the second was *PTSD: Invisible Wound*, raising awareness for post-traumatic stress among military combat veterans (2013); the third was focused on problems at Veterans Affairs (2015); and the fourth was the latest edition of *Miami Valley Murder Mysteries* (2016). In 2019, Cheryl earned a ninth Emmy for her role in covering the Oregon District mass shooting.

Cheryl also co-hosted the Children's Miracle Network Telethon from 1987 until 2014. She emcees a number of local events including The Hundred Club which awards police and firefighters for going above and beyond the call of duty, and the United Way Big Thanks breakfast which honors its volunteers.

Since 2007, Cheryl was honored twice as Best Anchor by the Associated Press and twice by the Society of Professional Journalists. She was also inducted into the Radio/TV Broadcasters Hall of Fame of Ohio and the Dayton Area Broadcasters Hall of Fame. She and 3 of her co-workers also received a regional Edward R. Murrow award in 2010 for a half-hour special called, *Domestic Violence: Breaking the Cycle*.

Cheryl enjoys spending time with her husband, Bob; their daughters, Christina and Maria; and their black Labrador, Missy. She is a big sports fan, loves to run and swim, enjoys cooking and relaxing by the pool with a wonderful book. Cheryl remains very dedicated to Carroll and has emceed many of its events.

Donna Palivec '70 Special Contributor



Donna was one of the first great female athletes who attended Carroll before Title IX was signed. She participated in intramural type activities her junior and senior year (bowling, volleyball and softball).

After graduation she attended Indiana University where she played volleyball for three years and swam for two years participating in the AIAW (Association of Intercollegiate Athletics for Women) National Swimming Championships. Donna played field hockey and basketball for one season in 1973 when Indiana finished fourth in the National Basketball Championships (NCAA did not start a national tournament until 1982). Donna also played softball all four years at Indiana.

Donna then went into coaching. She coached high school teams from 1974-1978: boys & girls swimming, girls track, girls basketball, and girls softball. In girls track, she coached a three-time state champion in the 880 and a two-timer in the mile. In girls swimming, she coached a two-time state champion in the 100-yard butterfly.

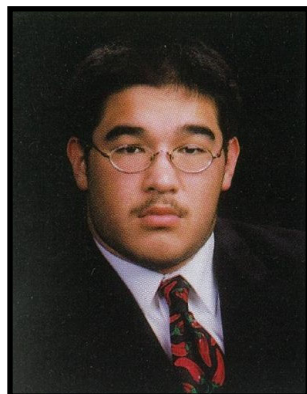
From 1978-1986 she was the head women's volleyball coach at North Dakota State University with a nine-year record of 336-160. At NDSU she coached four NCAA Division II All-Americans; one Olympic Bronze Medalist; and was inducted into the NDSU Athletic Hall of Fame in 1998. She also coached volleyball for five seasons at Montana State University and eight years at Bemidji State University in Minnesota. From 1992-93 she served as a USA Volleyball Coaching Educator. Donna was American Volleyball Coaches Association Director of Membership Services (1992-94), NACWAA/HERS Institute on Women in Athletic Administration participant, NCAA Division II North Central Region Volleyball committee chairperson, and NCAA Division II National Volleyball committee member (1996-98). Donna was inducted into the BSU Athletic Hall of Fame in 2017. She also received the Leanne Grotke Award at Indiana University in 2017, and was inducted into the Northern Sun Intercollegiate Conference Hall of Fame in 2018.

Donna is appreciative of the quality education she received at Carroll. She pursued her doctoral degree later in her professional career. A minimum score on the GRE was a requirement for admission. She had not taken any math courses in her undergraduate or master's degree programs. Instead, she relied on her strong Carroll math preparation to get the score she needed to be admitted to the doctoral program at the University of Minnesota.

Donna also has fond memories of her days at Carroll. "Fr. David Heinl, assistant principal during my years at Carroll, always brought an outside-of-the-box perspective to his work at Carroll. School was much more than attending classes. Two examples: 1) Carroll had a snow day which meant no school. Fr. Heinl loaded up the school's bus with some of us students and we went to a downhill ski area. I had never downhill skied and did not realize you do NOT ski straight down the hill. 2) When a stray dog showed up at Carroll, Fr. Heinl allowed us to keep her. We then discovered she was an expectant mother. We named her Ruffles and she stayed in the boiler room where she had 10 puppies!"

Patrick Barrentine Class of 2003

Patrick Barrentine won six varsity letters at Carroll. He lettered in swimming as a sophomore and football as a sophomore and junior; however, wrestling was where Patrick truly excelled, lettering three times.



Patrick was a three-time state placer at the OHSAA Division I State Wrestling meet. In 2001, he placed second at the 215lb weight class as a sophomore. His junior season he qualified and placed third at 215lb again. In his senior season Patrick carried the Patriot banner to the Division I State Championship at heavyweight.

He was a three-time league champ, three-time 1st Team All-Area, three-time sectional champ, and two-time district champ.

Patrick was also an eight-time All-American, two-time Greco Roman wrestling national champion, freestyle national champ, and competed in China as a member of the cadet world team.

In 2003, he was selected State Duals MVP and was the Greater Miami Valley Wrestling Association Wrestler of the Year. His career record was 135-13.

After graduation, Patrick took his wrestling skills to the Mixed Martial Arts becoming a professional MMA fighter for a while and went 10-5 as a heavyweight.

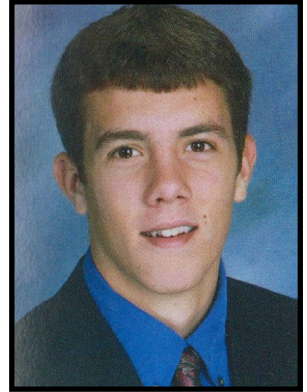
Patrick is currently an Arbitration Manager at Adesa Auto Auctions.

One of Patrick's fondest Carroll memories "was watching Steve Ritchie upset two wrestlers in a row at districts to make the state tournament our senior year."

Jeff Popella Class of 2006

Jeff was an excellent soccer player who earned three varsity letters at Carroll.

In his junior year he was selected to the 1st Team Mid Miami League (MML), the 1st Team All-Area South, and the Miami Valley District Team. As a senior he repeated all three of those accomplishments.



In 2005, Jeff's senior season, he was selected NSCAA/ADIDAS High School All-American, NSCAA Region V Team, 1st Team All-State, State Division II Player of the Year, Miami Valley Division II Player of the Year, and MML North Co-Player of the Year.

Jeff was also athlete of the year at Carroll for 2006. He was 3rd all-time in goals scored in a career with 65 and 4th all-time assists in a career with 37.

After graduation Jeff went on to play soccer four years for the University of Dayton. He then signed with the Dayton Dutch Lions F.C. in their inaugural season. After the season concluded, he started his career at DP&L (now AES Ohio) as a part-time customer service representative. He is now a program manager at AES Ohio for the Electric Choice department.

He and his wife, Sarah, have been married for one year and they have three dogs: Lucy, Peyton, and Obi.

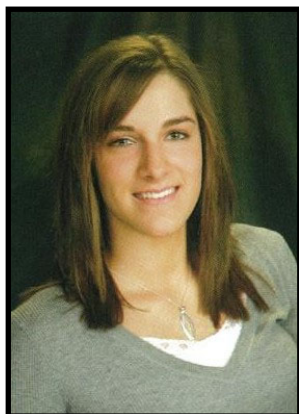
One of his favorite memories at Carroll was "getting to meet and bond with new teammates during the preseason. I also loved the pasta parties with teammates and family before a big game. More than anything, I really cherished playing under the lights at home on a fall Saturday night."

Jordan Jennewine Class of 2007

Jordan earned 10 varsity letters at Carroll including two 4C awards in cross country and track. She earned varsity letters in her sophomore and junior years in basketball.

She was basketball's Most Improved Player in 2005.

In cross country, she received All-Greene County in 2003 and 1st Team MML 2003-2005. After a change in leagues, she was 1st team GGCL in 2006, Team MVP 2004-2006, Academic All-Ohio in 2006, and All-State, finishing 23rd at state in 2006.



In track, she was selected Most Improved and smashed the school record in the 800m run. Jordan was named: Team MVP three times, a Coaches award winner, 2nd place finisher in Districts in the 800m run (2006), athlete of the year (2007), and Wendy's High School Heisman Nominee (2007).

After graduation Jordan attended The Ohio State University where she broke records in the 1500 meters and distance medley relay. She was 1st team All-Big Ten in track and was a two-time NCAA cross country qualifier.

Jordan graduated from Ohio State with a degree in health sciences and then continued at OSU to get her masters in clinical nutrition. Since college, she has worked as a sports dietitian at the University of Maryland and Ohio State. She currently works for a sports performance facility in Carmel, IN where she works with athletes from the high school to professional levels. She and her husband, Tyran, have a house just outside of downtown Indy.

Jordan remembers her years at Carroll fondly: "I remember the days in the fall leading up to some of our more important cross country meets and going outside for practice with all my friends on the team and feeling so happy to be there with those people. It was usually sunny but starting to feel a little chilly out, perfect running weather. We would head out for a lighter run leading up to meet day and I would love running and talking with my friends, being able to smell the leaves and fall in the air, feeling nervous for the upcoming meets, but just so enjoying being a part of a team and a school that felt so much like home. I still enjoy running and there are times that I will go out for a run in October or November and the smells of fall bring me right back to those days of the state cross country meet."

Andrew Trick Class of 2009

Andrew was an outstanding two-sport athlete and earned eight varsity letters at Carroll. He achieved the 4C award in both track and cross country and won the Patriot Award in 2008.

As a freshman in cross country, Andrew was 2nd team MML and was a state qualifier. He was a four-time state qualifier with the team finishing 11th in the OHSAA state meet sophomore year and 8th in both his junior and senior seasons. He was 1st Team GCL North and GCL North Runner of the Year 2006-2008.



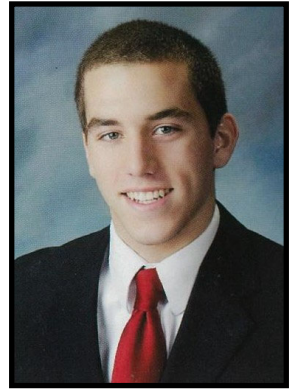
In track, Andrew received the team Coaches Award, 1st place in league for 3200m relay, 2nd team GCL for 800m run and 1600m relay, and 2nd place 800m run finish in the 2007 district meet. He was MVP junior and senior years. In the 2008 Division I district meet he was 2nd in the 1600m run (setting a school record) and 2nd in the 3200m relay. Andrew repeated his 2nd place finish in the 1600m run in the regionals and in the 3200m relay he finished 3rd. At the Division I OHSAA State meet Andrew finished 8th in the 1600m run. His senior year he was the GCL Co-Runner of the Year, 1st in the 3200m relay, and state qualifier in the 3200m relay.

After graduation, Andrew attended The Ohio State University. He married his wife, Heather, in 2013 and moved to Dallas for a work opportunity. They came back to the Dayton area in 2015 and started their family. He currently works in Cincinnati for a company called Rhinestahl, which supports General Electric by manufacturing their aircraft engine maintenance and manufacturing tooling.

"One of my favorite running memories comes from an infamous Saturday morning workout. Specifically, mile-repeat day at John Bryan. This workout involved running 1-mile trail loops at faster and faster paces. It was designed to be a grueling workout that simulated a race and pushed us to our max. We were in the middle of the workout: flying along the trail, gasping for air, legs on fire... running at our limits. Out of nowhere our coach (John Agnew) caught up to us, burst into our group, threw a "PICK UP THE PACE" at us, and effortlessly sprinted off with his loyal golden retriever, Kenyan, at his side. Never have I felt such demoralizing encouragement. We still are not sure what really happened and what was a workout hallucination but it is safe to say that John and Kenyan became a team myth."

Jonathon Buschur Class of 2010

Jonathon Buschur was a 4C winner in soccer at Carroll High School. As a soccer player Jonathon was chosen as a NSCAA/ADIDAS High School All-American. He was also Academic All-Ohio.



Jonathon was 2nd Team GCL North (2007), 3rd Team All-Area South (2007), 1st Team GCL North (2008-09), and Miami Valley District Team.

In his senior year he was chosen the Miami Valley Division II Player of the Year, and Greater Catholic League (GCL) North Player of the Year (all in 2009).

Jonathon was also selected as captain his senior year. During his high school career Carroll posted a 56-9-7 record and he was a member of the 2008 OHSAA State Championship Team.

After graduation from Carroll, Jonathon went to the University of Cincinnati to study electrical engineering. Upon graduating from UC, he moved to Pennsylvania to work as a contractor for the United States Navy. Jonathan is now chief engineer for Astroscale US, a space sustainability company, and he resides in Denver.

Jonathon fondly remembers "riding the bus to the 2008 state championship game watching the movie "Miracle" with the team. The busload had an unnatural quietness mixed with nerves and excitement as the US beat the Soviet Union as we pulled up to Columbus Crew Stadium. Talk about foreshadowing."

Kelley Austria Class of 2012



Kelley was a 4C award winner in basketball for the Patriots. She has a string of outstanding accomplishments.

In the 2011 state championship, Kelley was chosen MVP after scoring 26 points in the state finals game as the team finished State Runner-Up. She was chosen 2nd Team All-Ohio (2011).

Her senior season, Kelley was chosen as a Division II Ohio Player of the Year (2012). She was also a Rae Burick Women in Sports Award Runner-Up.

Kelley was not just a scorer for the team, she is ranked tenth in the State of Ohio in career steals (529). She set and still holds a Carroll record: 14 steals in a single game.

After graduation, Kelley attended the University of Dayton. In her junior year she secured a spot on the A-10 All-Defensive team. After a medical red shirt season, she came back and earned the Atlantic 10 Defensive Player of the Year. She was chosen as the White Allen Most Valuable Player.

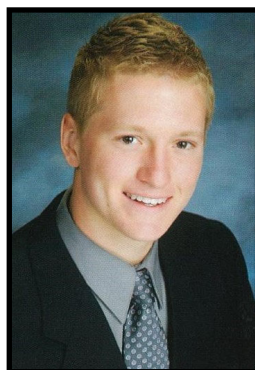
Kelley graduated from UD with a degree in exercise science. She then went overseas and played two seasons of professional basketball in Greece and Hungary. She returned to Carroll and joined the Carroll girls' basketball coaching staff for a couple of seasons. Kelley went back to school to become a physical therapist assistant and is currently in the process of applying to UD's doctor of physical therapy program to become a physical therapist.

"My favorite Carroll memory was playing in the state finals game my junior year. Getting to experience that moment with my teammates/coaches and having the support of the Carroll community was awesome."

Jonah Rieman Class of 2013

Jonah was an outstanding swimmer at Carroll earning the 4C award for lettering all four years.

Jonah was an All-Ohio swimmer seven times and GCL (Greater Catholic League) individual champion twelve times.



In 2013 Jonah was a major contributor to Carroll High School's 14 place men's team finish in the OHSAA swim meet. He finished 6th in the Ohio High School State Meet in both the 50 and 100 freestyle races. He was also part of the 200-yard relay team that finished 11th and the 400-yard relay finishing 16th.

Also, in 2013, he was selected as the Penn Station Athlete of the Month and the Subway Athlete of the Week.

Jonah was GCL North Swimmer of the Year (2012-13) and set the school record in the 50-yard freestyle at the districts (2012), and again in 2013 finishing 2nd at the districts. He also broke school records for the 200-yard medley relay, 200-yard freestyle, and 400-yard freestyle relay.

After graduation Jonah went to Florida Tech where he swam and earned his Bachelors of Science in Aerospace Engineering. Continuing his education, Jonah received his Masters of Science from Johns Hopkins and an MBA from the University of Kansas. "I worked for NASA and United Launch Alliance before moving to Amazon. Currently I am the Satellite and Launch Vehicle Integration Manager for Amazon's project Kuiper."

He has been married to his wife, Sydnee, for over two years and reports they have no kids but two dogs.

2010 State Champion Boys Soccer Team

Carroll won its third state championship in soccer, and second under Coach Scott Molfenter, in the fall of 2010. The season record was 19-2-2. The 2010 team was GCL North Champions, Regional Champions, District Champions, and State Champions. They were awarded the OSSCA Team Academic Award. The team ranked 4th in the final NSCAA/ADIDAS Region V Poll, 3rd in the final Division II State Coaches Poll, and 1st in the final Division II Miami Valley Coaches Poll.

Coaches included Scott Molfenter, Joe Flach '05, Daryl Jones, Dave Clymer, Mike Whitney '09, Umberto Speranza '10. The team statistician was Emily Kronenberger '11.

Being named to the Carroll Athletic Hall of Fame is the highest honor that can be awarded to former athletes, coaches, administrators, or boosters, by the Carroll Alumni Association.

The purpose of the Hall of Fame is to recognize individuals who have made "significant athletic contributions" to Archbishop Carroll High School, and assist the administration in perpetuating the spirit of pride and loyalty, which is the heritage of this institution.

There are two main categories for consideration: Athletes and Special Contributors. Athletes must be a Carroll graduate, and have lettered in at least one sport for two years, or two+ sports for one year. They may not be considered until 10 years after graduation. Special Contributors must have served Carroll, or be retired from CHS service.

The volunteer selection committee makes nominations and considers those from alumni and the community. Individuals from any era may be nominated. Online nominations can be submitted on the Carroll website. Once a candidate is nominated, his/her name cannot be removed from the list unless subsequent research discovers they do not meet the criteria.

Nominees are then voted on by the committee, and must be named on 67% of the ballots to be inducted. Post high school achievements may be noted, but are not part of the consideration for induction.

Archbishop Carroll High School History

Archbishop Carroll High School is a Catholic, coeducational school located within the Archdiocese of Cincinnati. Carroll was born in concept early in 1960, named after Archbishop John Carroll, the first bishop of the United States. The site was blessed April 8, and the school mascot was chosen in June. Two area eighth graders, Bernard Middleton '65 and Larry Cowman '65, each won a transistor radio for their suggestion that Carroll be the home of "The Patriots" with the colors red, white, and blue. The enrollment of 400 (freshmen only) arrived for Carroll's first registration on August 19, 1961. The first day of school was on September 6, 1961.
