Carroll Hall of Fame Guidelines

Established February, 2002

Being named to the Carroll Athletic Hall of Fame is the highest honor that can be awarded to former athletes, coaches, administrators, or boosters, by the Carroll Alumni Association.

The purpose of the Hall of Fame is to recognize individuals who have made "significant athletic contributions" to Archbishop Carroll High School, and assist the administration in perpetuating the spirit of pride and loyalty, which is the heritage of this institution.

There are two main categories for consideration: Athletes and Special Contributors. Athletes must be a Carroll graduate, and have lettered in at least one sport for two years, or two+ sports for one year. They may not be considered until 10 years after graduation. Special Contributors must have served Carroll, or be retired from CHS service.

The volunteer selection committee makes nominations and considers those from alumni and the community. Individuals from any era may be nominated. Online nominations can be submitted on the Carroll website. Once a candidate is nominated, his/her name cannot be removed from the list unless subsequent research discovers they do not meet the criteria.

Nominees are then voted on by the committee, and must be named on 67% of the ballots to be inducted. Post high school achievements may be noted, but are not part of the consideration for induction.

The committee sets no quotas by gender, sport, or era. Members are expected to be unbiased and fair minded. Also, the committee is sworn to strict confidentiality as to protect the candidates and maintain the highest standard of integrity.

2022 Ceremony Emcee

Cheryl (McHenry) Chabali Class of 1974

In 2008, Cheryl was inducted into Archbishop Carroll High School's Inaugural Distinguished Alumni Hall of Fame for her outstanding career achievement.

Since 1991, Cheryl has served as Evening News Center 7 Anchor at WHIO-TV.

After graduating from Carroll, she earned her Bachelor of Arts degree in Broadcasting from the University of Cincinnati. As a senior at UC, she was fortunate to have an internship at WKRC radio. Cheryl worked in radio news for three years, with stints at WING radio in Dayton and WCKY in Cincinnati, before landing a job as a reporter at WHIO-TV in August of 1981.

For much of the 1980's, she covered the Dayton Police/Montgomery County Courts beat, reporting on all kinds of stories from the local criminal justice system. During those years, Cheryl won four Emmy Awards. Three of them were for *Spot News* (now called *Breaking News*), and one for *Investigative News* for a 3-part series on repeat drunk driving offenders (1990). Since 2013, Cheryl has added four more Emmys for four half-hour special reports. One was *Miami Valley Murder Mysteries* (2013); the second was *PTSD: Invisible Wound*, raising awareness for post-traumatic stress among military combat veterans (2013); the third was focused on problems at Veterans Affairs (2015); and the fourth was the latest edition of *Miami Valley Murder Mysteries* (2016). In 2019, Cheryl earned a ninth Emmy for her role in covering the Oregon District mass shooting.

Cheryl also co-hosted the Children's Miracle Network Telethon from 1987 until 2014. She emcees a number of local events including the Dayton Defense Educational Foundation Charity Gala, The Hundred Club which awards police and firefighters for going above and beyond the call of duty, and the Holiday at Home scholarship dinner.

Since 2007, Cheryl was honored twice as Best Anchor by the Associated Press and twice by the Society of Professional Journalists. She was also inducted into the Radio/TV Broadcasters Hall of Fame of Ohio and the Dayton Area Broadcasters Hall of Fame. She and three of her co-workers also received a regional Edward R. Murrow award in 2010 for a half-hour special called, *Domestic Violence: Breaking the Cycle*.

Cheryl enjoys spending time with her husband, Bob; their daughters, Christina and Maria; and their black Labrador, Missy. She is a big sports fan, loves to run and swim, enjoys cooking and relaxing by the pool with a wonderful book. Cheryl remains very dedicated to Carroll and has emceed many of its events, including the Distinguished Alumni Hall of Fame and the Athletic Hall of Fame.

Archbishop Carroll High School History

Archbishop Carroll High School is a Catholic, coeducational school located within the Archdiocese of Cincinnati. Carroll was born in concept early in 1960, named after Archbishop John Carroll, the first bishop of the United States. The site was blessed April 8, and the school mascot was chosen in June. Two area eighth graders, Bernard Middleton '65 and Larry Cowman '65, each won a transistor radio for their suggestion that Carroll be the home of "The Patriots" with the colors red, white, and blue. The enrollment of 400 (freshmen only) arrived for Carroll's first registration on August 19, 1961. The first day of school was on September 6, 1961.

Rob Berry Special Contributor

Coach Robert (Rob) Berry was a dedicated and accomplished women's basketball coach for Archbishop Carroll High School.



Rob was the head women's basketball coach for 14 seasons. In that time, his teams won 260 games and lost only 87. Coach Berry's teams won 7 league titles between the Mid Miami League and the Girls Greater Catholic League. Seven times they were district champions, 5 times regional runners-up, and in 2011, they were state runners-up. In 2009, he was selected as the OHSAA Division II Coach of the Year.

With CYO the only option for girls to play basketball in grade school, Coach Berry started the Lady Spirit Basketball program which gave girls from Carroll's feeder schools a chance to play together before arriving at Carroll.

Rob loved basketball, everything from tryouts to practices, where he would always wear the opposing team's colors to motivate his players. He loved team dinners and taking teams to Wilmington, NC every other year for team camp. He loved taking a player with not much confidence or skill and making them believe they could do anything. He believed in every player he coached or taught at camp.

He had very fond memories of watching the teams come to his house to TP it. The girls never realized that their parents had called to make sure it was okay. As they covered the place with TP trying to be quiet, but often laughing, Rob and his wife were upstairs behind the curtains watching them.

Robert Berry was married to Kathy (Pierce) Berry '76. Together they had four children, all Carroll graduates: Brenden Robert Berry '00, Chelsie (Berry) Maloney '03, Tyler Pierce Berry '06, and Brogan (Berry) Magnarelli '08.

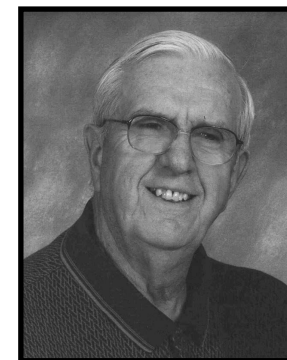

Charlie Keller Special Contributor



Charlie Keller began volunteering at Carroll in 1975 at the football stadium replacing and painting the bleachers. Charlie began working together with fellow Booster parent, Frank Klotz, on various projects at Carroll for more than forty years. They worked with three athletic directors and five football coaches.

As a veteran of the Marines, Charlie knew about hard work and those athletic directors kept him busy: weekly striping and mowing of all three football fields, repairing the whirlpool and the stadium concession stand's ice maker, maintaining all of the lawn mowers, and winterizing the stadium sprinkler system. Each year, Charlie and Frank would paint bleachers and then would be seen taking tickets for home basketball and wrestling contests.

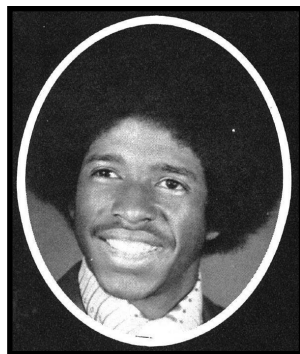
There were also some major projects along the way. In 1981, Charlie put together a group of volunteers to completely dismantle the visitor bleachers and replace them with new aluminum bleachers. Working six days a week on their own time, the group finished the project in 12 weeks. In 1982, Carroll joined the Western Ohio League (WOL) and with that came new requirements for the press box. An enclosed third floor was added for filming purposes. Charlie and another group of volunteers completed that project in time for the 1982 season.

This is only the tip of the iceberg for Charlie's work at Carroll. There is so much more. Charlie continued working at Carroll even after he retired from his job.

Behind every good man there is a woman holding down the fort. Charlie and Shirley were married in 1959. They raised seven kids, all of whom graduated from Carroll: Debbie '79, Donna '80, Darlene '81, Doug '82, Dan '84, Dennis '86, and Donnie '87. The Kellers had 23 grandchildren and 16 great grandchildren.

Stanley Gaither Class of 1976

Stanley Gaither was an excellent football and track athlete at Carroll where he earned six varsity letters. Stanley lettered twice in football and earned a 4C award in track.



As a football player, Stanley was selected the Most Improved Player as a senior. He finished with 36 career receptions and 549 yards receiving. In track, Stanley was team captain for three seasons and was chosen MVP his junior and senior years. As a senior, Stanley finished 4th in the OHSAA state meet in the 200-yard dash. (The state meet was in yards until 1980). Stanley also set records in the 200, which he still holds, and the 400 while at Carroll.

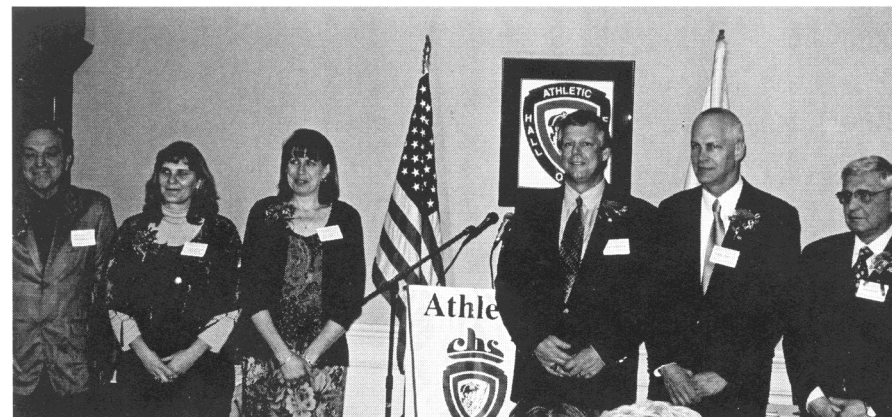
After Stanley graduated, he went on to play football and track at Central State University. Stan served in the USAF for 20 years and has been married to Mary Ann Thompson Gaither for five years. Stanley has retired but keeps busy as the head coach of the Springfield Courage Track Club and pastor of the Xenia Seventh Day Adventist Church in Xenia. He enjoys bowling, fishing, and gardening.

Stanley has many memories of his time at Carroll: "The greeting I received after the Xenia tornado from my fellow students who discovered I was not harmed by the tornado." Stan "the man" remembers coming from behind in the anchor leg of a 4 x 400 race at Carroll, even the baseball game stopping to watch him overtake the leaders of the race and win by a significant margin. Stanley recalls, "Our graduation was held the same day as the district finals at Welcome Stadium where I broke the school record in the 200m and 400m races and broke the meet record in the 400m. I didn't have time to change clothes for graduation so I just put my graduation robe on over my track suit. When receiving my diploma, my folly was exposed and they made me take off my robe as they informed the audience of what I had accomplished in the district finals and headed to the state track meet."

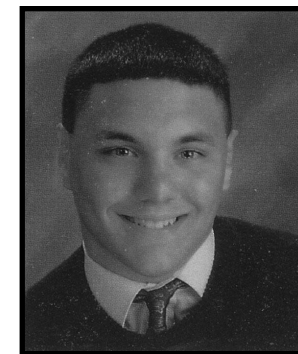

Greg Terbay Class of 1998



Greg Terbay was an outstanding multi-sport athlete at Carroll. In his four years, he earned eight varsity letters: one in track, three in football, and four in wrestling.

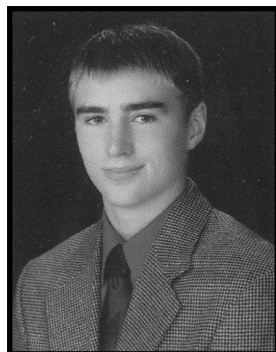
Greg was a two-way player on the line for Carroll football. In wrestling, Greg was a four-time district qualifier. In his senior season as co-captain, he led Carroll's wrestling team to the State of Ohio Dual Meet Championship. He was a two-time league champion, Patriot Award winner, and still holds the wrestling team's record for near falls.

After graduation, Greg continued wrestling at Wilmington College. He is currently working for Radians Incorporated. Greg lives locally and is married to Heather, also a 1998 Carroll graduate. Greg and Heather have two children: Paige (12) and Lucas (10).

Greg has many great memories of his years at Carroll. "If I have to pick one memory, it would be winning the State Dual Meet Championship. We as a team just squeaked in." The team was not expected to get out of the first round. "Somehow, somehow, the stars aligned and great things happened that day." Greg also values the "friendships I have formed from my time at Carroll and have carried on into my adult life and consider many to be family."

James Borchers Class of 2002

James Borchers earned a total of 12 varsity letters as a multi-sport athlete at Carroll. James received four letters each in cross country, wrestling, and track.



James was the first individual to earn 12 varsity letters while attending Carroll. In cross country, he was a four-time Mid Miami League (MML) second team, two-time district placer, and two-time All-Ohio Catholic second team. In wrestling, James was a runner-up in the Mid Miami League (MML) and a two-time MML champion. He was a runner-up in the sectional tournament twice and sectional champion his senior season, making him a three-time regional qualifier. In track, he was a two-time MML second team runner, two-time regional qualifier, and part of the school record setting 1400m and 3200m relay teams.

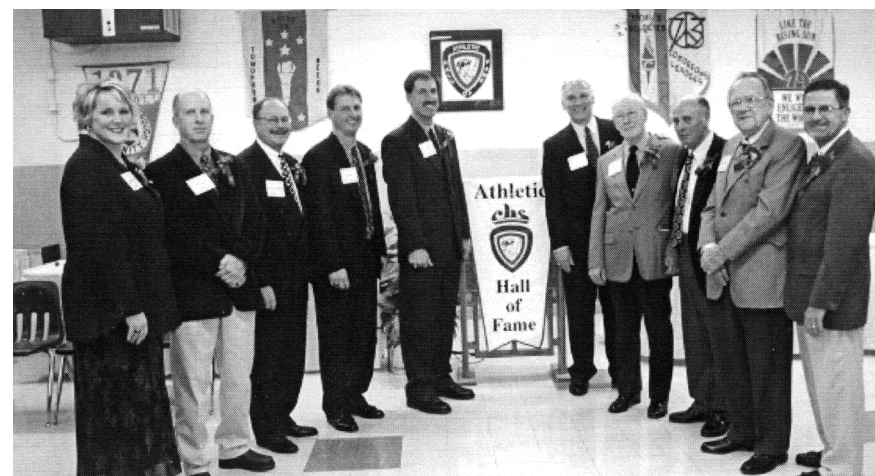
After graduation, James attended Wright State University where he helped start the WSU wrestling club. James also served in the United States Army and retired as a Major after 21 years of service and completing combat tours in both the Iraq and Afghanistan wars. He holds two master's degrees in Recreation and Liberal Studies from the University of Toledo and is currently working on his MBA at The George Washington University.

James has been married to Jennifer for nine years and they have two daughters: Madeline (8) and Katherine (5). James has many great memories of his high school years. He loved summer camps at Hocking Hills for cross country, winning sectionals in wrestling his senior year and traveling to the Beast of East Tournament in Delaware. He states, "Carroll impacted my future greatly. It was where I learned how to be resilient and overcome adversity. It helped give me the tools I would use later in life to survive war and combat. I am blessed to be a Patriot."

1998 State Dual Champion Wrestling Team



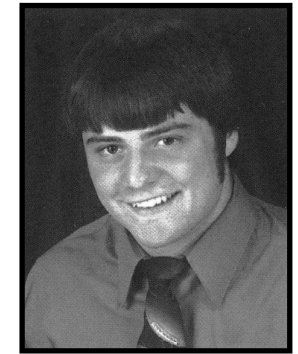
Archbishop Carroll High School won its first Dual State Championship in wrestling in the winter of 1998. Accomplishments included: League Champs, DeSales Champs, P.I.T. Runner-up, CIT 4th place, Eaton Champs, Graham Runner-up, Sectional Champs, 3rd place in Districts, and State Dual Champs.

Team members included Andrew Clemens '98, Joey Mauro '98, Pete Mauro, Andrew Wiley '98, Greg Terbay '98, Nick Dolezal '98, Brandon Dolezal '99, Benny Sexton '99, Brian Carmichael '99, Shawn Merkle '99, Mark DiSalvo '00, Daniel Rush '00, Anthony Stevens '00, Timothy Wiley '00, Jeff Clemens '01, and Matthew Western '01.

Coaches included Brian Carter, Mark Gerhard '72, Mark DiSalvo, Dan Wilson '84, Doug Callahan '84, Jeff Roberts '85, and Nick Mauro '86. Jason Riggs Class of 2006

Jason Riggs was an excellent football player at Carroll earning three varsity letters.



Jason was an outstanding linebacker for the Patriot football team. Carroll Athletic Hall of Fame Coach, Steve Bartlett, stated, "He was the best linebacker I ever coached." Jason was an important part of Carroll teams that won 33 games and had two final four appearances in the state tournament. He was a two-time all 1st team defensive player in the Mid Miami League (MML). As a senior, Jason was the MML North Player of the Year and All-Ohio 1st team. He led the Patriots in tackles all three varsity seasons and earned the Patriot of the Year Award in 2005 and Athlete of the Year in 2006.

After high school, Jason went to work in the family business and earned a Bachelor in Business from Wright State University. He then attended the University of Akron for his Doctorate of Audiology and then onto The Ohio State University for his PhD in Hearing Science.

Jason currently lives in Bellbrook with his wife, Jessica, and their three daughters: June (8), Jagger (4), and Journey (2).

Jason has some favorite memories from his years of playing football at Carroll. "Friday nights playing under the stadium lights with my family and friends in the stands cheering loudly." He especially remembers "beating undefeated number one seeded Springboro in the regional finals my senior year."

He states, "Being an athlete at Carroll taught me to be disciplined and focused in my work both on and off the field. Those structural building blocks laid the framework necessary to complete two doctoral degrees and maintain a successful career in the healthcare field."

Brogan (Berry) Magnarelli Class of 2008

Brogan earned six varsity letters at Carroll. She earned one in track, one in cross country, and was a 4-C award winner in basketball.

In basketball, Brogan was a first-team Mid-Miami League (MML) player as a freshman and sophomore. She was a MML player of the year as a sophomore. Carroll moved to the Girls Greater Catholic League (GGCL) and Brogan continued her success as she was chosen first team GGCL and Player of the Year in both junior and senior seasons. Brogan was selected to the All-Ohio Southwest team four times and Player of the Year as a senior. She was also selected to first team All-Ohio as a senior. She was a McDonald's All-American nominee and was named Penn Station Athlete of the Year in 2008.

After graduation, Brogan attended Harvard University where she continued her basketball career. As a freshman, she was selected Rookie of the Year in the Ivy League. Brogan was first-team All-Ivy League as a junior and senior. She graduated from Harvard with a B.A. in Psychology.

Brogan has been married to Patrick Magnarelli for four years and they have a daughter: Mila (1). Currently, Brogan is Vice President of Riverspan Partners, a private equity firm in Chicago.

Some of Brogan's favorite memories of her years at Carroll are bus rides, pasta parties, and team bonding across all of her teams at Carroll. "You become such a tight-knit group with your teammates and those memories enhance your passion for the sport. Also, the unforgettable experience to learn and be coached by my dad for my entire high school career."



Katie (Ollier) Chu Class of 2011

Katie was an outstanding multi-sport athlete at Carroll. She earned eight varsity letters in track, cross country, and swimming. Katie earned three letters in cross country, three in track, and two in swimming.

Katie excelled as a runner. She was second team Girls Greater Catholic League (GGCL) as a sophomore and junior. In her senior season, she was first team GGCL and was the North Player of the Year. That same season, she was 4th in the regionals and went on to run in the OHSAA state meet. In track, Katie's specialty was the 3200 meters.
