HOUSE KEEPING

The House System hasn't needed much time to begin to make a positive impact at Carroll High School.

The vision shared by House System Directors Martha Saurine and Matt Normile is already taking shape after just a few months in the students, staff, and faculty to create an even greater atmosphere where every Patriot can grow. A visit to any classroom during daily House time shows that this growth comes from more people than just the Carroll faculty.

"Some kids are starting to come out of their shell," Normile says. "I walk around during Family Room time and see students interacting with each other in a positive manner. I see teachers out of 'teacher mode' and conversing with students. Kids are starting to become more social, and the [student] leaders are becoming more accountable."

Increased mentorship from not just adults but each house's seven senior captains is one of the system's key components. Simple acts of inclusion, friendship, and kindness like singing "Happy Birthday" in Family Room time or seniors sharing their knowledge with freshmen have become more common as the students have become more familiar with each

other. Mrs. Saurine attributes those successes largely to the captains.

"The leadership I've seen in our captains has been amazing. When you see a kid that you know struggles socially, and he's singing, and laughing, and dancing on stage, that's incredible to me. **When you give an opportunity to every kid to shine, that means it's working,**" Saurine says. **"I see kids being more aware of the needs of others. When we talk about building community or building a family, the students know that others could be left behind and that they have to find a way to include them."**

The House System Directors and Deans meet regularly to plan the system's evolution. "Growth is the key word," Saurine says. "Even from first quarter to second quarter, what we've learned has been incredible." Developing ways for the House Captains to interact directly with Student Council and Campus Ministry is critical to the House System's ability to provide mentoring and inclusion for each student at Carroll.

"You want the system to evolve. You have to be adaptive to what the school needs and what the students need."

"You want the system to evolve. You have to be adaptive to what the school needs and what the students need. We have to keep learning and observing what's most important to the students' and how we can evolve the House System to fit those needs," Normile says.



As the years pass and students who were part of the House System during their time at Carroll become alumni, finding ways to involve alumni in the House System will become a crucial aspect of its success. Alumni who have children currently attending Carroll are encouraged to volunteer and help with that student's house. The system directors are exploring ways for alumni to experience what the House System has to offer, including volunteering to help judge House Event contests and competitions. The House System Directors are reviewing a process for alumni to join a house.

ST. MARY'S 5

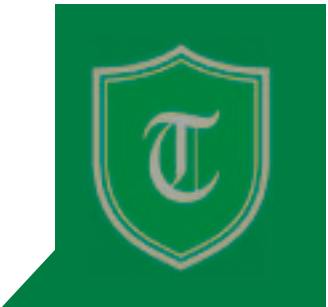

ALUMNI PROFILE

Meet Sr. Maria (Bete) Benedicta '13

Even as a young parishioner at Ascension, Sr. Maria (Bete) Benedicta '13 knew following God's call to religious life would be the path for her to walk as an adult.

Joining the liturgy committee, mass choir, and JAM (Jesus and Music) as a freshman were steps in that direction, but Sr. Benedicta points to the PATS Retreat in the spring of 2012 that solidified her commitment to pursue her vocation when her conviction began to waiver.

"I was chosen to go on it by the campus ministers at the end of my junior year so I could be a leader my senior year. At that time in my life, I was actually far away from my faith, and it was really that retreat and the sacrament of Reconciliation and the Mass on that retreat that brought me back to having a strong faith life and a strong relationship with God again that restarted my vocation. To have that opportunity to step back and reflect and look at your life in silence and in the moments of silence we had on the retreat was really helpful for me to re-evaluate my life."

After reaffirming religious life as her vocation, Carroll's faith-based environment continued to nurture Maria's pursuit in a deeper relationship with God. The Dominican Sisters of Mary from Ann Arbor, Mich., visited Carroll's vocation fair during Maria's senior year and encouraged her to take another life-changing retreat.

"On that retreat, I talked to the sister who is the vocation director (Sr. Joseph Andrew), and we talked about why I thought God was calling me. I was praying about it, and the community was praying about it. By the end of the retreat, I asked for the application papers, and Sr. Andrew felt that I was ready and that I very well might have a vocation."

While many of Maria's classmates applied to colleges and universities around the country, she sent her application to the Dominican Sisters of Mary and gained acceptance to the community months later to live in the convent for a pre-postulant week. This week of living the lifestyle of a nun and a long conversation with the community's vocation director culminated in Maria and the community deciding that God had called her to pursue her vocation of becoming a nun. Less than four months after receiving her Carroll diploma, Maria entered the convent on August 28 to live one year as a postulant.

Life as a postulant has quite a few similarities to life as a student at Carroll. All postulants wear white and navy blue uniforms and spend many hours discovering themselves and how God manifests Himself in their lives.

"It's very much a year of learning about the life, learning how to live in the community, and learning if this is really God's will for you. The best way to tell if you have a vocation is to live the life."

When her postulancy ended, Maria received her religious name Benedicta and white-veiled habit, marking the beginning of two years of novitate in the community. Sr. Benedicta and two other novices in the community made their first profession of temporary vows on July 29, 2016, and became Sisters of Sign within their community. She will spend the next five years attending Eastern Michigan University and Washtenaw Community College earning her teaching degree before making her final vows in 2021.

Each day begins for the sisters with a 5 a.m. wake up call, and they'll spend much of the day in prayer or attending school with just a few hours each day for meals and recreation. All the sisters are in bed by 10 to rest for another full day. Sr. Benedicta says most people would be surprised at how enjoyable she and the other sisters consider their vocations.

"We do have a lot of fun here. I've found since I entered that I have never laughed as much before I entered [the convent] as I do now. Even doing something simple like playing a board game at night with my sisters, we live together and know each other really well, and we all just want to have a lot of fun together. One of the

things that struck me when I entered is that on Patriot days like Labor Day, Memorial Day, Independence Day; we have a fun day. It's really beautiful how we celebrate national holidays. **Patriotism is part of the virtue of justice.** The morning might be normal, but we'll meet at the flagpole. One of the sisters who plays trumpet will play the national anthem, and we'll all sing. Then, we'll play games to celebrate, have a pick-up dinner, and watch a movie at night. Little things like that, because we don't have free time like that very often, are so much more special. I've found that before I entered, I took things like that for granted. The thing about religious life, first and foremost, is we gain so much more than we give up. I like to think of a vocation as what God made you for. Had I decided to get married, I might have well had a happy life, and I very well could have become a saint in that vocation, but what God specifically made me for to achieve total happiness is to give my life entirely to Him and to specifically be His bride and not somebody else's. It's so similar to marriage because you find that man or woman you love, and you want to be with them your entire life. You don't really think 'Oh, this is everything I'm giving up' or 'it's going to be so hard when I have kids and have to make sacrifices for them.' It's really the same with religious life. For us we found Christ, and he's the man that we want to give our lives to. **We are giving things up, but the focus is that we're receiving Him in return for everything we give up. When it really comes down to it, He more than fulfills everything that we give up to give our lives to him.**"

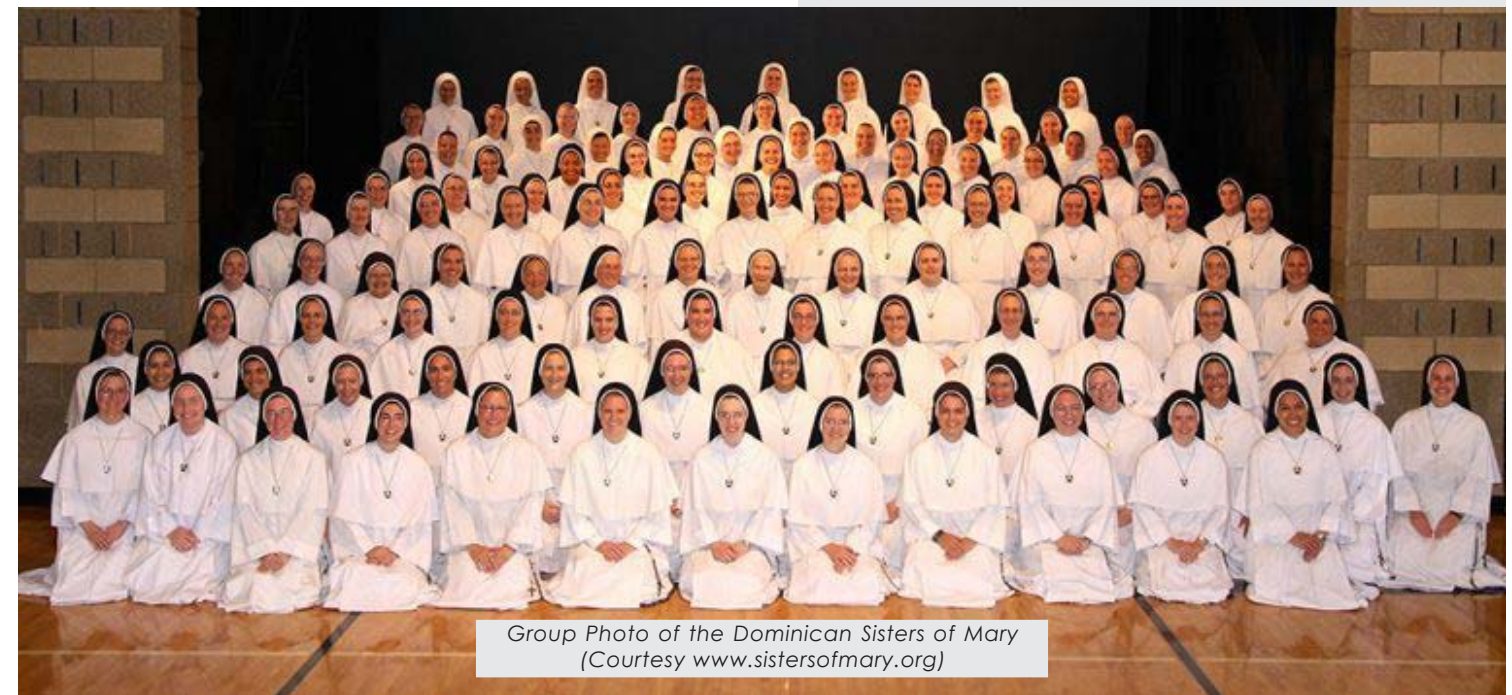
Sr. Benedicta's advice to anyone considering pursuing this type of vocation is simple.

"One of the most important things in discerning a vocation is to spend time in prayer. When we take our profession, we're marrying Christ, and you can't marry somebody that you don't know. Going to daily mass when I could, going to eucharistic adoration, and spending time in His presence was probably one of the most influential parts of my vocation. Even if you don't feel like you're praying or getting anything out of it, just being in His presence really helps you get to know Him and gives you the grace to be able to respond to Him in the way that He wants you to."

Sr. Benedicta was the first member of her family to graduate from Carroll High School. Her brother, Paul, is a member of the Class of 2015, and her younger sister, Annie '18, is a current Patriot. Her youngest sister, Grace, is planning to attend Carroll as a member of the Class of 2023. CHAPEL REDEDICATION

All Are Welcome



Carroll High School began a new era in its legacy of Catholic education on November 27, 2016 as dozens of alumni, faculty and staff members, students, and friends of the school gathered for the rededication of St. John the Evangelist Chapel.

Auxiliary Bishop Joseph Binzer led the congregation gathered outside the chapel through its doors in a solemn procession to begin the rededication mass. Water is featured throughout John's gospel, and much of the chapel's design reflects that theme. Sunlight poured through stained glass windows decorated with blue and sea-green waves, providing the only light in the chapel as Bishop Binzer used newly consecrated holy water to bless the assembly, chapel walls, and altar. Carroll's Campus Ministry Department carefully selected liturgical readings and musical selections filled with water imagery for mass to further channel the substance's nourishing power.

Larry Blanford, '72 and his wife Lynn (Volk) '78, major contributors to the project, attended the Mass. Larry says moments from that day will stay with him forever.

"The rededication Mass will remain one of our favorite lifetime memories. Thoughtfully planned by Campus Ministry, celebrated by Bishop Binzer and multiple holy priests sharing this time with our parents, uncle and aunt, our two children, son-in-law, and granddaughter, our brothers and sisters, and Carroll student/alumni niece and nephews alongside all the people who believed in, contributed to, and led the renovation and Mass. **It seemed a slice of Heaven."**

The rededication Mass and following reception were the culmination of months of work on the \$360,000 construction project and years of contributions to the *Future for Carroll Major Gift Initiative*, a fund intended to improve the Carroll campus and renovate existing facilities. When Blanford visited Carroll High School for the first time after graduating decades ago, the vision of transforming St. John the Evangelist Chapel from a small space tucked away behind a classroom to the focal point of Carroll's mission began to fill his heart and mind.

"Before the renovations, the chapel seemed small, dark, and not particularly set off as a place of

worship. It seemed inadequate to support the integration of faith with education, which Carroll strives to achieve in the formation of students," Blanford recalls. "Now, it is modest, but beautiful, with the restored original tabernacle at the center. The new entry clearly calls out the presence of a holy place. The heartfelt design and workmanship, the many thoughtful contributions of Carroll staff and families, and the spirituality it brings to the school, will hopefully inspire many hours of prayer, serenity, and sacrament to everyone who enters."



Between 2015 and 2016, more than 80 families and individuals made direct contributions to bring the vision of a renovated chapel to life. Blanford hopes this project inspires a total renewal of Carroll High School with contributions from every Patriot.

"One could first choose to replace windows or lockers or renovate the football field. While all of these things are important, the primary purpose of Catholic schools is to nurture the faith of its students and thus support the future of the Church. **At any and every level, every donation and volunteer hour helps. None of us have the resources of a Bill Gates, but all of us can help make a difference in the lives of our future generations.** No educational system does it better than Catholic schools, however drafty our windows may be. Carroll High School is an excellent testament to this premise."

Description of St. John the Evangelist Chapel by Jim Murray, Carroll High School Campus Minister.

St. John the Evangelist Chapel is located in the heart of the Carroll campus. One theme in the heart of John's gospel is water. John's use of Old Testament passages illustrates Jesus' plea for those who thirst for God. Within the first four chapters of his Gospel, St. John lifts up those who testify to whom Jesus Christ is for us: John the Baptist in the River Jordan, Mary at the Wedding at Cana, and the Samaritan woman at the well. Even at Jesus' life-giving death on the cross, blood and water flow from Jesus' side. His Spirit miraculously becomes "living water." Our renovated chapel draws richly on the power that this symbol holds in our Christian faith.

Upon entering, the holy water font invites us to enter the space through a symbolic reminder of our baptism. The bowl, created by Carroll High School Art Department Chair Betty Peterson, uses the same glass as in the windows. This font bowl compliments the motif of the colorful, moving waters. The wave pattern in the flooring invites us to join the Christian community gathered as attention turns to the sanctuary furnishings.

The altar and ambo were designed and handcrafted by Joe Jackson '03. The eye-catching color of the lighter wood tones and stain of the birdseye maple and cherry help to center the assembly of the Table of the Word and Table of the Lord. All of the chapel's tables; the altar, ambo, holy water font, and credence tables; each have a unique top. We recognize how Christ's presence is made known to each of us in a unique, personal way. The deep blue art glass from the water in the windows is present in each table as well.

In the sanctuary, the restored original tabernacle connects with the water theme with symbols not just of bread, but of fish as well. Even the altar candles and processional cross have flowing, wave-like accents.

The rich stained glass windows were designed and fabricated by Jason Boyer. Here, most prominently, the moving, living waters flow. The varied colors and textures of the art glass capture the ebb and flow of rolling waves from one window to the next, just as we gather as a mixed body on our own journey of faith.

"Whoever believes in me, as scripture says: 'Rivers of living water will flow from within him'" (John 7:38)

» Google Suite

A new class is helping students learn the best ways to use their Chromebooks as Carroll's one-to-one technology initiative approaches its third year. The Computer Science Department started offering "Google Suite" last Spring as a way to teach students how to use Google's web-based applications. Beginning in Fall 2017, every student will have his or her own Chromebook computer, bringing the one-to-one technology initiative to full realization. This one semester class teaches students the critical thinking skills needed to learn any software.



"The best way to learn software is to figure it out on your own, click on things, see what happens, look around, and investigate it," Business Department Chair and course instructor Linda Edwards said. "They've been through Microsoft products, they're going through Google products, and they'll be prepared to go through whatever comes their way by the time they're in college."

The course covers Google's word processor (Docs), spreadsheet (Sheets), multimedia presentation (Slides), graphic design (Drawings), e-mail (Gmail), cloud-based storage (Drive), and survey (Forms) applications. Google regularly updates these applications, ensuring that the students are always using the most recent versions of the programs.

"Google is updating everyday," Edwards said. "They're constantly changing things. It teaches students how to adapt to the newest and most productive methods so that they aren't wasting time in science class trying to figure out how to type a paper."



» Election Day

AP Politics and Government students watched their knowledge of the election process play out in class during November's general election. Mr. Normile's class of juniors began the class by analyzing the content of several websites and drew conclusions about any potential bias toward particular candidates, parties, or issues. They also examined poll data and previous election results to predict which candidate would win the Presidential election.

"We've learned how people usually vote, and we've learned how certain areas of the country won't flip and will mostly always vote Democrat or Republican," Maria Schlegel '18 said. "We've learned about the candidates' backstories and policies, and we've learned about the voting process and how the electoral college operates so that we have enough background information to make predictions about how the vote will turn out."

The students also examined how each Presidential candidate's platform aligned with church teachings. Schlegel noted that finding a candidate whose message consistently reflected Catholic values was not an easy task.

"There's not a specific party that has views that line up with everything the Church teaches. I've learned that you have to pick and choose which issues are the most important to you. If you're going to vote based on candidates who are anti-abortion or candidates who are anti-death penalty, you might not find a candidate who is against both. If you're going to vote based on faith, you have to choose which faith issues are most important to you and vote that way."



» Principal Sableski honored for STEM Education leadership

The Science Education Council of Ohio (SECO) awarded Principal Matt Sableski '91 with the Administrator Award for Leadership in Science Education at its annual meeting in Columbus. SECO awards this distinction to "current Elementary, Middle Level, and High School administrators who have demonstrated leadership in the development, implementation, and maintenance of an outstanding school science program; supported staff development in science; promoted positive relationships between the school's science program and the community; and have been advocates and leaders for the development of science process skills and positive attitudes toward science among students, parents, and teachers."

The group chose Principal Sableski as the winner of the award for overseeing the addition of AP Biology to the school's course offerings, creating a Science Olympiad team, his dedication to science fair, Ohio Math League, TEAMS, and the school's financial investment in its science department.



» Math Madness hits Carroll

Some of Carroll's brightest mathematicians are competing against students from around the country in a "March Madness" style tournament. Mathematics Department Chair Mary Ollier introduced Math Madness to Carroll this fall, and dozens of Patriots have taken up the challenge. The group competes one day per week to solve problems based on traditional American Mathematics Competitions material. Scores are displayed in real time when groups compete at the same time or revealed after the second group completes the questions when a "live" match is not possible. AreteLabs, the organization that oversees the competition, describes the event as **"a structure that motivates students throughout the entirety of a school semester, one of enough time duration and frequency that students can observe actual progress and, in turn, amplify their efforts to continue on that path."**



» Laying a foundation for STEM Education

Carroll's Industrial Technology program has added another opportunity for students to learn "real world" applications for STEM Education with a new course offering. Applied Technology introduces students to common equipment and STEM principles used in fields like mechanical, computer-aided, and architectural drafting. This is one of the first course offerings of its kind available to freshmen.

"When students can take a thought, express it on paper, and take it from idea to drawing, and then a finished project, the meaning of each step makes more sense," Industrial Technology Chair Mike Lakin said. "Having taught junior students, I know that the incoming freshman need this type of instruction."

The course is designed to help students translate elements of design, geometric constructions, and 3-D modeling to professions in engineering, interior design, and any career that requires the ability to read blueprints. Students can take a second semester of the course to continue development of STEM concepts.

» Volleyball Team Service

The girls' volleyball team served up nutritious meals and warm blankets to some of our area's neediest families throughout a day of service during their season.



The Patriots began their day at The Foodbank in Dayton to help sort and pack lunches for needy school-aged children throughout Greene, Montgomery, and Preble counties. When the team returned to Carroll, they spent the afternoon assembling twist blankets to donate to an area Catholic pre-school. "It was a good team bonding experience," team captain Abby Schrand '17 said. "As students at a Catholic school, it's good to give back to the community and do it together as a team."



» PATS Camp

Carroll's summer camp programs have always helped children discover and grow their athletic, artistic, and academic talents; but a unique camp is providing members of Dayton's special needs community a week of opportunities to experience the fun of summer camp. **PATS (Patriot Adaptive Training and Skills) Camp offers four nights of learning how to play different sports and tailors each activity to enable campers of all abilities a chance to experience the teamwork and fun of each event.**

"Just helping out the little kids and seeing the smiles on their faces, whether you're shooting hoops with them or passing around a soccer ball, it just made their day a lot better, so that made my day better as well," Joe Cogan '17 said. "It makes me an all-around better person by helping out these kids and making their lives just a little bit better. It makes me realize how good I have it."



The free camp began in 2013 with just a few camp participants and Carroll student and staff volunteers. Now, **current Carroll students spend a portion of summer vacation playing adaptive versions of soccer, basketball, volleyball, and other sports with dozens of camp participants.** "Since the first year I helped, there's been more volunteers to play with the kids," Chloe Lloyd '17 said. "More kids have shown up, and we have different activities to do. We make sure each kid has fun no matter what their circumstance is." On the final night of camp, many campers run onto the field in Patriot Stadium and team up for a game of touch football. Others work with Carroll's varsity cheerleaders to learn the same cheers heard at Patriot football and basketball games to complete the Friday night lights experience.

"I just feel blessed that I even have the opportunity to work with the kids," Lloyd said. "They're always so happy to be around anyone who wants to play. It's just nice to see their faces." 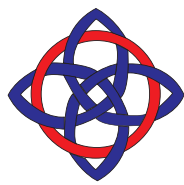

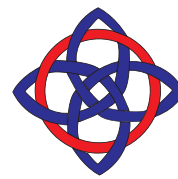

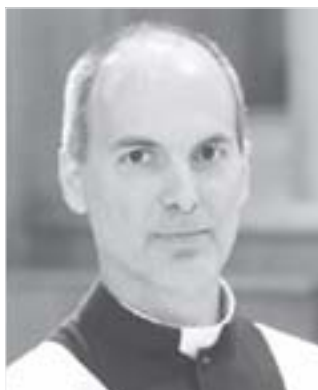

PILGRIMAGE TO ISRAEL Prayer Wall

In November, retired Carroll religion teacher Denise Stieritz traveled to Jerusalem and placed a prayer for Carroll High School in a crack of the remains of the Western Wall of the Second Temple. This is her account of that day:

"Traveling in the footsteps of Jesus, one of the places I visited was the Western Wall. Jesus walked by and faced this sacred and now venerated site when coming up to the temple mount in Jerusalem to preach, pray, and heal and during the days of his Passion. He was crucified, entombed, and rose from the dead close by.

It is believed by Jews to be the closest place on earth to God as the Ark of the Covenant was housed in the Holy of Holies inside the Second Temple which stood above it. The wall is one of the few remaining structures standing from that time when the temple complex was destroyed in 70 AD by the Romans.

People write prayers and petitions on small pieces of paper and place them in the crevices of the wall; Pope Saint John Paul II, Pope Benedict XVI, and Pope Francis among them. The spirit of Carroll High School is now contained in these stones as I placed a prayer there for you which reads:

"Lord, God, bless, protect, and give your life, love, and joy to all these and those they love: ...(the) Carroll High School community past and present..."
